

The German Society for Good Research Practice (DGGF) is Germany's largest, and Europe's second largest, association dedicated to quality management in the chemical and pharmaceutical industries. Our work focuses on assuring optimum quality with regard to research and development of chemical, pharmaceutical and agrochemical substances. This includes meeting statutory regulations, as well as adapting to the requirements of industrial change. Good research practice helps assuring high quality and safety through the finished product – and hence, for people and the environment.

DGGF is a registered, nonprofit association founded in 1995. Our mission is
